I. INTRODUCTION

This case concerns plaintiffs, Jane Doe and John Doe, U.S. citizens and resident of this County where this court is venued for Jane Doe, resident of Los Angeles county for John Doe, on behalf of themselves and all others similarly situated, who have suffered the death of beloved parents, children and siblings, and resulting from that, suffered severe emotional distress, harassment, anxiety, suffering, sleepless nights and other assorted grief and anguish due to the conduct, actions, participation, and material support of defendant Tapang Ivo Tanku ("Tapang") to his agents, joint venturers, forces, organization named Ambazonia Defense Forces ("ADF") which culminated in the death of plaintiff Jane Doe's father and brother on May 20, 2018, and Plaintiff John Doe's father in August of 2018.

Plaintiff Jane Doe files this complaint on behalf of herself, and others similarly situated, approximated in the thousands, residing here in the United States, citizens or residents of the United States, and/or Cameroonians, but who have lost loved ones and family, pain and anguish and suffering, due to the conduct and actions of defendant Tapang. Plaintiff John Doe files similarly.

Defendant Tapang, from what he presumes is a safe harbor hiding place at his San Jose residence in the USA, while he engages in terrorist acts occurring in Cameroon, has spectacularly and beyond any reasonable doubt (see Exhibits A and B charts illustrating over one hundred posts and videos, and hyperlinks to Tapang's postings and links to his video posts, with all charts information and accompanying links documents and videos, fully incorporated herein) conducted himself and acted, participated, and materially supported actions by the ADF, for which he is the spokesperson, which has lead not just to the death of plaintiffs father and brother, but also of hundreds of innocent civilians.

Terrorism is broadly defined as "the unlawful use of violence and intimidation, especially against civilians, in the pursuit of political aims as," and "international

terrorism," according to 18 U.S.C. § 2331 as "activities that involve acts or acts
dangerous to human life that are in violation of the criminal laws of the United States
or of any State, that would be a criminal violation if committed within the jurisdiction
of the United States or of any State." The conduct, actions, participation, and material
support of Tapang to the events of the May 20th attacks in Cameroon is terrorism in
miniature, as well as all other ADF and armed separatist groups attacks on innocent
civilians in the North West and South West regions of Cameroon. Because of the
foregoing, there can be no doubt: Tapang is a terrorist, and one of the highest
order. He must be stopped. While Tapang and his ilk will surely seek to hide behind
the protections of Constitutional First Amendment Rights to free speech, this case is
not about inhibiting their rights to free speech, or to engage in political advocacy, or
as a rights group, and it expressly disavows any such intentions, but it is about their
conduct, actions, material support, and participation in terrorism, which lead to
plaintiffs injuries. Tapang has engaged in conduct and actions equating to "training",
"expert advice or assistance," "service", and providing "personnel" to the Ambazonia
Defense forces and its fighters, leading to deaths of innocent civilians, including the
parents and siblings of plaintiffs.
To better understand this case, a brief synopsis of the background of this matter

To better understand this case, a brief synopsis of the background of this matter will be enlightening. Tapang is the spokesperson for a group that hails itself as Ambazonia Defense Forces ("ADF") with a stated political aim of secession or separation from the Republic of Cameroon. However, in seeking that political goal, Tapang, his agents, joint venture associates, co-conspirators, ADF and related organizations, engage in acts of terrorism against innocent civilians that do not subscribe to their stated political goal of separation from the Republic of Cameroon to form an Ambazonia state, and it is such actions that led to the death of plaintiff Jane Doe's father and brother, plaintiff John Doe's father, and sufferings of plaintiff residing here in the USA. This same story is applicable to all other plaintiffs, US

residents and citizens, victims of Tapang's conduct and actions that constitute material support of terrorism, which he conducts from within the territorial jurisdiction of the United States.

The loss of one's life is never adequately compensated by monetary compensation. Accordingly, this complaint will also seek a preliminary and permanent injunction, as well as declaratory relief, against any and all conduct, actions, participation, and material support of terrorism against Tapang, his organizations, supporters, accomplices, and DOES defendants, who will be named once discovery gets going and they are identified.

Plaintiffs will file, as appropriate, criminal complaints with the FBI offices with jurisdiction over Tapang's residence, police reports with local police terrorism units, as well as complaints with the immigration authorities for his immigration law violations. Plaintiffs seek, and will get, God willing, justice for themselves and all others similarly situated.

NATURE OF ACTION

- 1. This is an action for damages against Ivo Tanku Tapang and DOES 1-5000, pursuant to the Antiterrorism Act, 18 U.S.C. § 2333 ("ATA") for aiding, abetting, and knowingly providing material support and resources to the Ambazonia Defense Forces (ADF) and other armed militia groups that carried out May 20th attacks that killed plaintiff Jane Doe's father and brother, plaintiff John Doe's father, as wells attacks throughout circa October 2016 to present that has killed hundreds of innocent civilians, who are the parents, children, and spouses, of US citizens and residents natives of Cameroon.
- 2. The ATA's civil remedies have served as an important means for enforcing the federal criminal anti-terrorism provisions since the early 1990s.
- 3. Congress enacted the ATA in October 1992 as a legal complement to criminal penalties against terrorists that kill or injure Americans abroad, specifically

intending that the civil provisions would not only provide a mechanism for compensating victims of terror but also serve as an important means of depriving terrorists of financial resources to carry out attacks.

- 4. Following the bombing of the World Trade Center in New York by al-Qaeda in1993, Congress targeted terrorist resources again by enacting 18 U.S.C. § 2339A in September 1994, making it a crime to provide material support or resources knowing or intending that they will be used in preparing or carrying out terrorist acts.
- 5. In April 1996, Congress further expanded the effort to cut off resources to terrorists by enacting 18 U.S.C. § 2339B, making it a crime to knowingly provide material support or resources to a designated foreign terrorist organization.
- 6. In the wake of the terror attacks on the United States by al-Qaeda on September 11, 2001 killing nearly 3,000 Americans, Congress amended the "material support" statutes, 18 U.S.C. §§ 2339A-B, via the PATRIOT Act in October 2001 and the Intelligence Reform and Terrorism Prevention Act of 2004, to impose greater criminal penalties for violating these statutes and to expand the definition of "material support or resources" prohibited thereby.
- 7. The Ambazonia Defense Forces ("ADF"), of which Tapang is the spokesperson, is the "official" military wing of the Ambazonian separatist movement, and although other smaller, independent militias exist, they tend to cooperate closely with the ADF if not absorb into it altogether.
- 8. Officially, ADF aims to raise the cost of Cameroon's military presence in the region higher than the profits the country gets from there; their aim is to make North-West and South-West regions of Cameroon "ungovernable", and to coerce, intimidate, kill, kidnap, harm any innocent civilians who do not obey or agree or subscribe to their political goals.

- 9. According to RFI journalist Emmanuel Freudenthal who was embedded with the ADF for a week on or about June of 2018, ADF has about 1,500 fighters spread around 20 camps in Anglophone Cameroon.
- 10. At several points in 2018, Amnesty International and Human Rights Watch have accused the ADF separatists, materially supported by defendant Tapang and DOES defendants, of violently enforcing the boycott of government schools by destroying over 40 schools and assaulting teachers who refused to comply. They've also been accused of kidnapping civilians suspected of working with the government.
- 11. Tapang, and the ADF, have repeatedly threatened to kill or harm civilians, and do kill and harm civilians, who engage in any civic duty such as going to school, voting, or not adhere strictly to their revolutionary edicts.
- 12. Tapang and DOES Defendants knowing provide material support to the ADF, its fighters, agents, and related organizations, with the knowledge and intent, that they execute violent acts and crimes, in violation of USA laws, and such violent acts and crimes, not only harm Cameroonians living within Cameroon, but also a substantial portion of USA citizens of Cameroonian origin, whose parents, siblings, children, extended family are killed, businesses ruined, property stolen, and thus they suffer intolerable pain and anguish; or kidnappings, and the US based Cameroonians are contacted to pay ransom, as happens hundreds of times.
- 13. By providing material support and platform, including Does defendants holding fund raising activities for Tapang and the ADF, Tapang violated the federal prohibitions on providing material support or resources for acts of international terrorism (18 U.S.C. § 2339A), and committed acts of international terrorism as defined by 18 U.S.C. § 2331, as well as violated numerous other Federal and State criminal laws, as described further below. Accordingly, Tapang and Doe defendants are liable pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 2333 to the plaintiffs, who were injured by reason of acts of international terrorism.

14. Plaintiffs' claims are based not upon the speech communications of Tapang and Does defendants on social media postings, but upon Defendants provision of the infrastructure, platform, which provides material support to ADF and related armed militia in Cameroon.

THE PARTIES

- 15. Jane Doe, a resident of this County, along with her siblings lost their father in the May 20th attacks in Kumbo as further detailed below. Jane Doe is a citizen of the United States. The nondisclosure of Jane Doe's identity is necessary for Jane Doe and her family's life, as Tapang and his ADF are currently operational and engaging in consistent acts of terrorism. As the 9th Circuit has held, pseudonyms may be used to protect a party from "injury", and "a party may preserve his or her anonymity in judicial proceedings in special circumstances when the party's need for anonymity outweighs prejudice to the opposing party and the public's interest in knowing the party's identity." Does I thru XXIII v. Advanced Textile Corp., 214 F.3d 1058, 1067-68 (9th Cir. 2000)(quoting United States v. Doe, 655 F.2d 920, 922 n.1 (9th Cir. 1981). Plaintiffs will seek leave of court to proceed under a pseudonym.
- 16. John Doe, a resident of Los Angeles County, along with his mother and siblings, lost their father, due to the actions of Tapang providing material support to ADF forces, who killed their father because he allegedly cooperated with the government of Cameroon. The nondisclosure of John Doe's identity is necessary for John Doe and his family's life, as Tapang and his ADF are currently operational and engaging in consistent acts of terrorism. As the 9th Circuit has held, pseudonyms may be used to protect a party from "injury", and "a party may preserve his or her anonymity in judicial proceedings in special circumstances when the party's need for anonymity outweighs prejudice to the opposing party and the public's interest in knowing the party's identity." Does I thru XXIII v. Advanced Textile Corp., 214 F.3d

1058, 1067-68 (9th Cir. 2000)(quoting United States v. Doe, 655 F.2d 920, 922 n.1 (9th Cir. 1981). Plaintiffs will seek leave of court to proceed under a pseudonym.

- 17. DOES Plaintiffs 1 -1000 are nationals of Cameroon, whether living in the USA or in Cameroon, who have suffered injury or harm, whether to themselves, or death of their parents and siblings, due to the actions of Tapang and DOES Defendants. Plaintiffs have setup a website, www.cameroonvictims.org, where similar plaintiffs, whether residing in the USA or in Cameroon, may submit in confidentiality the story of their loss, so that plaintiff's attorney may join them in this lawsuit.
- 18. Defendant Ivo Tanku Tapang, an individual, resides within this district, in San Jose, California. A substantial portion of his material support activities were conducted within this district.
- 19. DOES defendants 1 through 5000 are US residents, nationals, citizens, who are natives of Cameroon, who have provided financial and other material support, including training, expert advice or assistance, service, and personnel, to named defendant Tapang Ivo, his ADF, agents, fighters, and related organizations, in violation of Federal and State Anti-terrorism laws, and other criminal statutes.
- 20. DOES defendants 1 through 5000 are US residents, nationals, citizens, who are natives of Cameroon, whose conduct, voluntary or involuntary, supports or promotes the goals of Tapang Ivo, his ADF, agents, fighters, and related organizations in violation of Federal and State Anti-terrorism laws, and other criminal statutes.

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

21. The Court has jurisdiction over this case under 28 U.S.C. §1331 (federal question jurisdiction); and 28 U.S.C. §1332 (diversity jurisdiction).

- 22. Jurisdiction over this action further exists pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §1332, as there is complete diversity of citizenship between the parties and the amount in controversy herein exceeds \$75,000.00, exclusive of costs.
- 23. Venue lies in the Northern District of California because defendant Ivo Tapang Tanku resides within the Northern District of California, and that a substantial portion of the relevant events which are the conduct and actions of defendant Ivo Tapang Tanku occurred, transpired, and/or originated within the Northern District of California.
- 24. Venue in this District is proper pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§1391(b)(2) and 1391(f)(1), as defendant resides in this district, and a substantial part of his terrorist conduct and actions giving rise to this litigation occurred within this District,
 - 25. Venue is further proper in this district pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §2334(a).
- 26. The defendant Tapang Ivo is subject to jurisdiction pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §1331, in that, as set forth in detail below, this action: seeks money damages against Tapang Ivo for injury and death caused by the May 20th Attacks, which constitute an act of "international terrorism" in the United States as defined in 18 U.S.C. §2331; alleges that the May 20th Attacks and the resulting injuries and deaths were caused by a tortious act or acts of Tapang and his agents and joint venture partner ADF, by Tapang providing material support and resources to and facilitating the Ambazonia Defense Forces leaders, planners and killers responsible for the May 20th Attacks, and that such act or acts constitute more than mere negligence, and were intentional, knowing, reckless, willful and/or grossly negligent. Under similar material support, Tapang's material support actions led to the death of John Doe's father.
- 27. The defendant Tapang Ivo is also subject to jurisdiction pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §1331 in that, as set forth in detail below, this action seeks money damages against the Tapang Ivo for injury and death occurring in the United States and caused

8	28. In the 1980's, terrorist groups carried out a number of major terror			
9	attacks around the world, killing and injuring many Americans abroad.

31. This new chapter contained a new section titled, "Terrorist acts abroad against United States nationals," providing criminal penalties for killing, conspiring, or attempting to kill a national of the United States, or engaging in physical violence with the intent to cause serious bodily injury to a national of the United States or that results in serious bodily injury to a national of the United States.

- 32. In addition, Congress later enacted the ATA, which established a private cause of action for U.S. nationals injured by acts of international terrorism, as a legal complement to the criminal penalties against terrorists that kill or injure Americans abroad.
- 33. In enacting the ATA, Congress specifically intended that the civil cause of action would not only provide a mechanism for compensating victims of terror, but also serve as an important means of depriving terrorists of financial resources to carry out attacks.
- As the ATA was being considered in Congress, the State Department's 34. Deputy Legal Advisor, Alan J. Kreczko, testified before the Senate Judiciary Committee's Subcommittee on Courts and Administrative Practice that this proposed bill "will add to the arsenal of legal tools that can be used against those who commit acts of terrorism against United States citizens abroad."1
 - The Deputy Legal Advisor also testified: 35.

"[T]his bill will provide general jurisdiction to our federal courts and a cause of action for cases in which an American has been injured by an act of terrorism overseas.

We view this bill as a welcome addition to the growing web of law we are weaving against terrorists. . . . The existence of such a cause of action . . .may deter terrorist groups from maintaining assets in the United States, from benefiting from investments in the U.S. and from soliciting funds within the

Complaint For Damages, Injunction and Declaratory Relief

- 39. On February 26, 1993, a group of *al-Qaeda* terrorists detonated a truck bomb under the North Tower of the World Trade Center in New York City, attempting to cause the collapse of both towers and the death of thousands of Americans.
- 40. Although the damage from the World Trade Center bombing was limited, it nevertheless killed six people and injured more than one thousand.
- 41. In response, Congress again took aim at the resources available to terrorists in September 1994 and enacted 18 U.S.C. § 2339A, making it a crime to provide material support or resources to terrorists, knowing or intending that they would be used for terrorist acts.
- 42. Tapang and DOES defendants engage in the provision of material support of terrorism through their ADF and its agents and soldiers, ad defendants conduct through fund raising meetings, declarations for actions which incite immediate and imminent hard to innocent civilians, their officially declared aim of conduct intimidation and threats against civilians, of kidnappings, and their acknowledged kidnappings, killings, of civilians they find non-compliant with their civilian goals. Tapang provides expert advice or assistance, personnel, training, and service to the ADF and related armed militia who conduct acts of violence, intimidation, killings against civilians in the Anglophone regions of Cameroon.

PLAINTIFF SPECIFIC FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS AGAINST TAPANG AND HIS ORGANIZATION ADF

- 43. Plaintiffs, still with a heavy heart from her loss, and mindful that she is going up against defendant Tapang, a terrorist, who does not value human life, and who has terrorist ADF forces at this disposal, beck and call who may wreck further unimaginable pain to her and family at his instructions, however, bravely, by and through their undersigned counsel, hereby further specifically allege:
- 44. Plaintiffs, individually and on behalf of those similarly situated, are the surviving children of the victims murdered in the May 20, 2018 terrorist attacks which killed plaintiffs' father and brother in Kumbo, Bui Division, North-West Region,

Cameroon. (the "May 20th Attacks") and individuals who suffered personal injuries in the May 20th Attacks incited, participated, assisted, contributed materially, organized, and supported by defendant Tapang Ivo, as well as all those innocent civilians who have suffered similar losses circa October 2016 to present due to the conduct and material support of Tapang and his accomplices, ADF, and Doe defendants.

- 45. Plaintiffs seek such relief against the Tapang Ivo for the attributable acts of the Ambazonia Defense Forces and its bodies, alter -egos, and officers, employees and agents acting within the scope of their office, employment or agency by Tapang knowingly providing material support and resources to the Ambazonia Defense Forces terrorist organization and facilitating the May 20th Attacks, deaths of hundreds of others, in that, as set forth in detail herein, he:
 - a. Raised, laundered and paid substantial financial support to Ambazonia Defense Forces to fund its budget and terrorist activities, including the preparation and execution of the May 20th Attacks, and scores of other violence, intimidation of civilians, and destruction of property.
 - b. Funded the terrorist training camps in the North-West and South-West regions of Cameroon where Ambazonia Defense Forces indoctrinated and taught their soldiers how to carry out guerilla warfare, intimidation, violence, and terrorism against any military or uncooperative or unsupportive civilians.
 - c. Provided critical logistical support and resources to Ambazonia Defense Forces around North-West and South-West regions of Cameroon, funding safe houses, transferring Ambazonia Defense Forces money, weapons and equipment across international borders and other assistance, all of which enabled Ambazonia Defense Forces to conduct the May 20th Attacks and kills scores of other civilians;

- d. Actively supported Ambazonia Defense Forces in its final preparations for the May 20th Attacks through a network of the their soldiers, officers, and/or agents who met with and aided the ADF killers, providing them with money, cover, advice, contacts, transportation, assistance and other material support and resources.
- 46. Provides expert advice or assistance to the ADF and related organizations through his regular Facebook postings, YouTube videos, which advises the ADF fighters how, when, to act, stance to adopt, how to react, and instructions on punishments to meter to innocent civilians who don't obey, including plaintiffs parents.
- 47. Similar to paragraph 50 above, Tapang provides the afore-noted services to the ADF and related organizations as described in paragraph 50. These services also recruit "personnel" for the ADF and related organizations, serve as media and public relations for the ADF and related organizations and armed militia groups.
- 48. Provides ADF and the armed militia with training on how to engage in subterfuge, propaganda, to achieve their goals of separation from the Republic of Cameroon.
- 49. All the above-noted actions are in violation of 18 U.S.C. §§ 2339A, the statute that prohibits the provision of material support with the knowledge or intent that the support be used to carry out a terrorist attack.

DOCUMENTS AND POSTS BY TAPANG SUPPORTING ALL FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

50. Attached as **Exhibit A** to this complaint is conduct and postings and articles detailing specific conduct and material support by Tapang noted in paragraphs 43 through 53, that are directed to inciting, and in fact do incite, imminent lawless action, with such conduct and speech, not only likely to produce such lawless action,

but actually did produce the lawless action, including but not limited to, the May 20th attacks where plaintiffs father and brother died, as well as loss of hundreds of innocent civilian lives in the North-West and South-West regions, terrorizing students from not going to school for over two years and ongoing, from late 2016 to present, disruption of business and commercial activities, and instigating fear in all civilians in these regions to adhere strictly to the edicts from defendant Tapang and his organization.

51. Exhibit A reflects plaintiffs' allegations that Tapang's conduct, actions, and speech intended to incite a violent or lawless action, and that the action was likely to imminently occur, and in fact did occur repeatedly, as a result.

VIDEOS OF TAPANGS CONDUCT AND ACTIONS SUPPORTING ALL FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

52. Attached as **Exhibit B** to this Complaint is the table comprising 37 separate columns of videos, noting date of video and title of video, illustrating the conduct, actions, and speech of Tapang showing his material support of ADF terrorism in general, the May 20th attacks, and ongoing, and evidencing his material support of training, expert advice or assistance, service, and personnel provided to the ADF and related militia.

Ivo Tapang's knowledge of Ambazonia Defense Forces and its terrorist agenda against decedents prior to May 20, 2018 and continuing.

53. In a wide variety of actions and conduct leading to the attacks on May 20, 2018, which caused Jane Doe's father's death, Ivo Tapang promised death, harm, retribution, and injury to any civilians who dared to support the May 20th Independence day celebrations of the Republic of Cameroon, as well as since October 2016, has consistently supported violence, intimidation, and criminal acts against civilians who do not strictly abide by his organization's edicts, such as, "ghost town", where all shops must be closed, and "no schools," a prohibition against students returning to school until his aim of an independent Ambazonia state is achieved.

54. At all relevant times mentioned herein, Ivo Tapang: adopted an extremist
version of secession, seeking violence and terror and kidnappings and intimidation
against any non-compliant civilian as the means to achieve secession from the
Republic of Cameroon.

55. As detailed herein, Ivo Tapang's ADF agents, partners, and joint venture associates, continued to provide material support and resources for Ambazonia Defense Forces through late 2016, and including May 20, 2018 to present, combined actions that led to plaintiffs parents death, and the deaths of hundreds of others.

Ivo Tapang's tortious acts were a proximate cause of the May 20th Attacks and the killings of hundreds of civilians.

- 56. The planning for the May 20th Attacks began, on information and belief, on or about March of 2018, as Tapang decided to forcefully stop and any all May 20th (which is Cameroon's Independence Day) celebrations in the North-West and South-West Regions.
- 57. Tapang and his accomplices, and DOES defendants, set in motion, a series of postings, threats, warnings, to any Anglophone civilian who dares venture outside to acknowledge or "celebrate" the 20th of May independence day, that is, customarily, a cause of celebration in prior years throughout the Republic of Cameroon.
- 58. On that fateful day, Jane Doe's father and brother, being present in Kumbo, and having been suspected of being sympathizers to the government of Cameroon, were shot down by fighters of ADF for "leaving their home."
- 59. A witness to the incident stated that Jane Doe's father had been sick for a few days, and it was urgent that his son take him to the hospital, and when his condition deteriorated drastically on the morning of May 20th, they had no choice but to try to seek medical attention and leave their residence. Yet, in using the material

support provided by Tapang, ADF fighters mercilessly killed Jane Doe's father and brother as suspected sympathizers of Cameroon's government and for violating their strict edict for no May 20th celebrations.

- As detailed herein, at each stage of Ambazonia Defense Forces' planning 60. and execution leading up to the May 20th Attacks, Ivo Tapang knowingly provided Ambazonia Defense Forces with support, financing and resources that were material, substantial and critical to the success of the May 20th Attacks.
- 61. John Doe's father was killed by Tapang's ADF because, as they stated and posted his dead body in social media groups, he was a traditional ruler and spy of the Cameroon government.

Ivo Tapang's direct funding of ADF

- Ivo Tapang is responsible for coordinating and raising substantial 62. funding of Ambazonia Defense Forces that was vital to the operation of that terrorist organization and its preparations for and realization of the May 20th Attacks, as well as all other attacks and killings of innocent civilians from late 2016 to present, including but not limited to the following:
- 63. Top ranking Ivo Tapang sympathizers made substantial financial contributions to Ambazonia Defense Forces;
- From 2017 through and including May 20, 2018, Ivo Tapang, acting 64. through his agents, joint venture associates, and partners, including Does Defendants 1-5000, have raised money through meetings, groups, social media, to support their ADF fighters and related organizations in executing their stated political aims and official positions, which includes terrorism as defined in USC code against innocent civilians. Some of these civilians have relatives abroad here in the USA, and their death, torture, kidnapping directly affects their USA citizen families.

Ivo Tapang's material support of ADF camps used to indoctrinate and provide terrorist training for ADF soldiers

- 65. Tapang's ADF fighters and others involved in supporting the May 20th Attacks, and the violence and armed separatist groups from late 2016 to present, were indoctrinated and given their terrorist training necessary to prepare for and execute the May 20th Attacks and other attacks at one or more Ambazonia Defense Forces terrorist training camps located in the bushes of the North-West and South-West regions, far from where there are roads or easy accessibility.
- 66. Prior to and including May 20, 2018, to present, Ivo Tapang provided logistical support to Ambazonia Defense Forces in additional ways, as will be determined through further investigation, disclosures and discovery of Ivo Tapang.

Ivo Tapang's material support for Ambazonia Defense Forces' planning and execution of the May 20th Attacks, and numerous other attacks against innocent civilians, students, and government officials.

- 67. Ivo Tapang provided material support and resources for Ambazonia Defense Forces and their fighters directly linked to the actual planning and execution of the May 20th Attacks, numerous other attacks in hundreds from late 2016 to present, attacks against students who seek to go to school, government officials, including but not limited to the following:
 - i. Fund raising
 - j. Using his Facebook posts to provide instructions on strategy, policy, and ADF regulations
 - k. Recruiting of fighters
 - 1. Assistance with procuring and providing weapons, equipment, and other tangible materials.
 - m. Coordination with other separatists groups abroad and in Cameroon
 - n. Leadership of the ADF in the USA

o. Expert advice and assistance on how to obtain separation by violence and force from Cameroon

- p. Assistance with the training of ADF fighters
- q. Using other social media such as email, twitter, Skype, WhatsApp to promote ADF violent agenda, plan the dates and times of attacks, and other activities in violation of USA laws.
- r. Recruiting of administrative personnel in the USA to assist the ADF in all aspects of its goals.
- s. Providing media relations service, coordination services, for the ADF in the USA; and so on and forth, without limitation.

Ivo Tapang's domination and control of ADF conduct

- 68. As set forth herein, at all relevant times, Tapang used his position from the USA to effectuate all the various services, conduct, and duties, without limitation, listed in paragraph 71 above, and paragraphs 43 through 53.
- Tapang is the spokesperson of the ADF and de facto leader of the ADF 69. in the United States.
- 70. Attached as **Exhibit C** is a selected excerpt from the venerable Human Rights Watch, the report section discussing the violence and abuses of armed separatist groups like the ADF in Cameroon.
- 71. Attached as **Exhibit D** is chart comprising two hundred (200) articles, posts, references with regards to the crimes, terror, torture, kidnappings, and other national and international law violations of the ADF.

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION TO RECOVER PERSONAL INJURY AND WRONGFUL DEATH

DAMAGES PURSUANT TO THE ANTI-TERRORISM ACT

Plaintiffs repeat and re-allege all of the preceding paragraphs as if fully 72. set forth herein.

Jane Doe, John Doe v. Ivo Tanku Tapang Complaint For Damages, Injunction and Declaratory Relief

- 73. This action is brought pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 2333(a) for the injuries and deaths suffered by U.S. nationals' parents and siblings in the May 20th Attacks as well as other attacks causing plaintiffs harm and injuries.
- 74. Those attacks constituted acts of international terrorism pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §2331 that violated federal and state laws against murder, kidnapping, assault and aircraft hijacking, including but not limited to 18 U.S.C. §2332b (prohibiting terrorist acts of kidnapping, assault and murder).
- 75. Pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §2333(a), (d), Ivo Tapang aided and abetted Ambazonia Defense Forces through numerous acts detailed herein by knowingly providing it with substantial material assistance to prepare and carry out an act or acts of international terrorism.
- 76. Pursuant to 18 U.S.C. §2333(a), (d), Ivo Tapang conspired with Ambazonia Defense Forces and others to provide it with substantial material support and resources, with the shared understanding, knowledge and intent that said support and resources would be used by Ambazonia Defense Forces to prepare and carry out an act or acts of international terrorism.
- 77. The others in the conspiracy currently known to plaintiffs are not named herein, but include Ayaba Cho, Chris Anu, Boh Hebert, Akwanga Ebenezer, Mark Bareta, Ikome Sako, Eric Tataw, and others.
- 78. Pursuant to §2333(a), Ivo Tapang committed an act or acts of international terrorism, as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 2331(1)(A), in violation of federal and state criminal laws, or that would have been a criminal violation if committed within the United States or any state, including but not limited to a violation of the following:

- b. 18 U.S.C. §371 Conspiring to commit a federal crime;

or procuring a federal crime;

a. 18 U.S.C. §2(a) — Aiding, abetting, counseling, commanding, inducing

- c. 18 U.S.C. §2332b Conspiring to commit an act of terrorism;
- d. 18 U.S.C. §2339A Providing material support to terrorists; e. 18 U.S.C. §2339C - Prohibitions against the financing of terrorism;
- CA Penal Code §31 Accomplice liability Aiding and Abetting Law;
- g. CA Penal Code §182 Criminal Conspiracy
- h. CA Penal Code §32 Accessory after the fact
- Tapang's conduct amounted to a violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2(a) because 79. Tapang intentionally aided, abetted and counseled the commission of a criminal act or acts of international terrorism by Ambazonia Defense Forces, including its operatives, by providing the terrorist organization with material support, resources and funding with the knowledge that Ambazonia Defense Forces would use such assistance to prepare for and commit such a criminal act or acts.
- 80. Tapang's conduct amounted to a violation of 18 U.S.C. §371 because it conspired with Ambazonia Defense Forces and others to provide it with substantial material support and resources with the shared understanding, knowledge and intent that said support and resources would be used by Ambazonia Defense Forces to prepare for and carry out a criminal act or acts of international terrorism.
- 81. Tapang's conduct amounted to a violation of 18 U.S.C. §2339A in that on and prior to May 20, 2018, and continuing today, he provides material support or resources for Ambazonia Defense Forces and/or conspired with Ambazonia Defense Forces and others to provide material support or resources for Ambazonia Defense Forces, with the knowledge or intent that they would be used in preparation for, or in carrying out a violation of the statutes specified in 18 U.S.C. §2339A, including 18 U.S.C. §2332b (prohibiting terrorist acts of kidnapping, assault and murder) and violation of others laws as itemized in paragraph 80.
- 82. Tapang's conduct amounted to a violation of 18 U.S.C. § 2339A in that it concealed or disguised the nature, location, source, or ownership of Ambazonia Defense Forces' material support or resources and/or conspired with ADF and Tapang's agents, Tapang's accomplices, Ambazonia Defense Forces, Ambazonia

Defense Forces operatives and sympathizers and others, known and unknown, to conceal or disguise the nature, location, source or ownership of Ambazonia Defense Forces' material support or resources, with the knowledge or intent that they would be used in preparation for, or in carrying out a violation of the statutes specified in 18 U.S.C. §2339A, including 18 U.S.C. §2332b (prohibiting terrorist acts of kidnapping, assault and murder) and violation of others laws as itemized in paragraph 80.

- 83. Tapang's conduct amounted to a violation of relevant state criminal laws on facilitating, aiding and abetting a crime, and conspiracy, including but not limited to those cited above, in that it:
 - a. intentionally aided, abetted and counseled Ambazonia Defense Forces by providing it with material support, resources and funding with the knowledge that Ambazonia Defense Forces would use such assistance to commit an act or acts of international terrorism; and/or
 - b. believing it was probably rendering aid in the form of material support or resources and funds to Ambazonia Defense Forces to engage in a crime, provided Ambazonia Defense Forces with the means or opportunity for the commission thereof and which in fact aided Ambazonia Defense Forces to commit the May 20th Attacks; and/or all other attacks and intimidation on innocent civilians from October 2016 to present.
 - c. conspired with ADF leaders, soldiers, and fighters, particularly the Ambazonia Defense Forces, Ambazonia Defense Forces operatives and sympathizers and others known and unknown, to violate relevant state criminal laws on facilitating and aiding and abetting a crime and committing an act or acts of terrorism, including assault, kidnapping and murder.
 - 84. As detailed herein, the aforesaid act or acts of international terrorism:

the known and foreseeable outcomes of injury and death resulting from providing substantial assistance to Ambazonia Defense Forces terrorists; b. were committed primarily outside the territorial jurisdiction of the United States and also transcended national boundaries in terms of the means by

a. involve a violent act or acts dangerous to human life, as demonstrated by

- States and also transcended national boundaries in terms of the means by which they were accomplished, the persons they appear intended to intimidate or coerce, and the locales in which their perpetrators operated; and
- c. appeared to be intended to intimidate or coerce a civilian population; to influence the policy of a government by intimidation or coercion; or, to affect the conduct of a government by mass destruction, kidnapping or assassination.
- 85. The aforesaid acts of Tapang were not mere negligence, but each act individually and/or in combination with one or more acts, constituted conduct that was intentional, reckless, willful and/or grossly negligent and each of those acts individually and/or in combination with one or more of those acts was a proximate cause of the May 20th Attacks, other relevant attacks, and the resulting injuries and deaths of plaintiffs' parents and brother, as well as that of hundreds of other Anglophone Cameroonians.
- 86. The May 20th Attacks, other attacks from October 2016 to present, could not have occurred absent the knowing and substantial assistance provided to Ambazonia Defense Forces by Tapang and those attacks and resulting injuries and deaths were a natural, probable and reasonably foreseeable consequence of Tapang's conduct.
- 87. As a result, the Tapang and all DOES defendants are liable to plaintiffs for all damages resulting from the injuries and deaths in the May 20th Attacks, as well as the deaths and sufferings of all those similarly situated as plaintiffs.

88. Plaintiffs, the surviving family members of each decedent, the decedents
and their Estates have suffered and will continue to suffer past and future damages as
a result of the injuries and deaths sustained in the May 20th Attacks and all attacks
from October 2016 to present, including but not limited to: personal injury damages.
wrongful death damages, survival damages, economic damages, pecuniary loss, non-
economic damages, pain and suffering, torture, imprisonment, kidnapping, fear of
impending death, physical trauma, mental anguish, mental distress, grief, loss of
enjoyment of life, loss of earnings, financial support, services, companionship, care,
guidance, consortium, burial costs, medical and other expenses and other provable
damages allowed by law.

89. WHEREFORE, plaintiffs pray that judgment(s) for relief in the form of an award or awards of monetary damages for personal injury, wrongful death, all recoverable losses under 28 U.S.C. §2333 and other appropriate relief be entered on their first cause of action in favor of the plaintiffs individually and as estate representatives and against the defendant Tapang Ivo, with separate awards for each plaintiff, where appropriate, plus interest, costs, punitive damages, treble damages, attorney's fees, and such other relief as the Court deems just and proper.

SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION FOR PERSONAL INJURY AND WRONGFUL DEATH DAMAGES PURSUANT TO STATE TORT LAW

- 90. Plaintiffs repeat and re-allege all of the preceding paragraphs as if fully set forth herein.
- 91. Prior to and including May 20, 2018, Ivo Tapang: participated and associated with Ambazonia Defense Forces in its terrorist agenda as set forth herein; provided Ambazonia Defense Forces and its fighters with substantial material support, financing and resources; knew that it was assisting a terrorist organization that had

conducted and was actively planning attacks against the United States; and committed tortious acts and omissions that were intentional, knowing, reckless, willful, wanton, grossly negligent and/or negligent.

- 92. Tapang's conduct was a proximate cause of the deaths, injuries and resulting damages suffered by plaintiffs, as it furnished the essential support networks, cover and funding used by Ambazonia Defense Forces to successfully plan and execute the May 20th Attacks, as well as attacks that has killed hundreds of innocent civilians.
- 93. Tapang tortuously aided and abetted Ambazonia Defense Forces by providing substantial assistance in the form of funding, support and resources to Ambazonia Defense Forces and its fighters with the knowledge that they planned to use such assistance to prepare for and conduct terrorist attacks against innocent civilians in Kumbo, Bui Division, North-west region as well as in other parts of Anglophone Cameroon, and acted with reckless disregard of the known probable risk that such assistance would be used for those terrorist purposes.
- 94. Tapang tortuously conspired with Ambazonia Defense Forces and others to provide Ambazonia Defense Forces and its fighters with substantial material support and resources, with the shared agreement, understanding, knowledge and intent that said support and resources would be used by Ambazonia Defense Forces to plan and carry out terrorist acts against the United States.
- 95. Despite such knowledge, Ivo Tapang intentionally and/or recklessly failed to properly supervise its ADF soldiers, fighters, officers, and agents and to stop them from using Ivo Tapang's resources, but rather desired to provide substantial assistance to Ambazonia Defense Forces, despite the known and/or foreseeable risk that such assistance was being used by Ambazonia Defense Forces to prepare and conduct a terrorist attack on May 20th, as well as other dates, resulting in plaintiffs harm.

96. Moreover, Ivo Tapang intentionally and/or recklessly selected, hired and retained as its ADF fighters, soldiers, officers, agents, and various individuals, and others, who Ivo Tapang knew were Ambazonia Defense Forces operatives or sympathizers, despite the known and/or foreseeable risk that these persons and agents would use and/or were using their positions to provide substantial assistance to Ambazonia Defense Forces to prepare and conduct the May 20th attacks, as well as other attacks against innocent civilians in the Anglophone regions.

- 97. The aforesaid intentional, criminal, knowing, reckless, willful, wanton, grossly negligent and/or negligent acts and/or omissions of Ivo Tapang were individually and/or in combination with one or more of those acts and/or omissions a proximate, a substantial cause of the May 20th Attacks, as well as other attacks, and the plaintiffs' injuries, deaths and resulting damages.
- WHEREFORE, plaintiffs pray that judgment(s) for relief in the form of 98. an award or awards of monetary damages for personal injury, wrongful death and other appropriate relief be entered on their second cause of action in favor of the plaintiffs individually and as estate representatives and against the defendant Tapang Ivo, with separate awards for each plaintiff, where appropriate, plus interest, costs, punitive damages, treble damages, attorney's fees, and such other relief as the Court deems just and proper.

THIRD CAUSE OF ACTION FOR PERSONAL INJURY AND WRONGFUL DEATH DAMAGES PURSUANT TO THE ALIEN TORT CLAIMS ACT

Plaintiffs repeat and re-allege all of the preceding paragraphs as if fully 99. set forth herein.

- k. Protocol Additional (II) to the Geneva Conventions of 12 August 1949, and Relating to the Protection of Victims of Non-International Armed Conflicts, June 8, 1977, 1125 U.N.T.S. 609;
- 1. Statute of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia (ICTY), in Report of the Secretary-General pursuant to paragraph 2 of S.C. Res. 808, May 3, 1993, U.N. Doc. 8/25704, adopted unanimously by S.C. Res. 827, U.N. SCOR, 48th Sess., 3217th mtg., 16, U.N. Doc. S/PV.3217 (1993);
- m. The Convention on the Prevention and Punishment of Crimes Against International Protected Persons, Including Diplomatic Agents, 28 U.S.T. 1975, T.I.A.S. No. 8532 (1977), implemented in 18 U.S.C. § 1121;
- n. The General Assembly Resolutions on Measures to Prevent International Terrorism, G.A. Res. 40/61 (1985) and G.A. Res. 42/159 (1987); and
- o. The Convention on the High Seas, April 29, 1958, arts. 14-22 (piracy), 13 U.S.T. 2312, 450 U.N.T.S. 11.
- 102. Tapang's conduct was a substantial cause of the May 20th Attacks and all other attacks from October 2016 to present against innocent civilians in the North West and South West regions, and the plaintiffs' injuries, deaths and resulting damages.

FOURTH CAUSE OF ACTION FOR RICO (18 U.S.C. § 1962(C))

- 103. Plaintiff re-alleges and incorporates by reference all prior paragraphs of this Complaint and paragraphs in the counts below as though set forth fully herein.
- 104. Tapang and all Does Defendants 1-5000 (collectively "Defendants") are all "persons" within the meaning of 18 U.S.C. § 1961(3). At all relevant times, Defendants conducted the affairs of an Enterprise—which affected interstate and foreign commerce—through a pattern of racketeering activity, in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1962(c).

A. ADF is the Racketeering Enterprise

105. ADF is a Racketeering Enterprise, as that term is used in 18 U.S.C. § 1961(4). The Enterprise was formed by January of 2017.

106. ADF had an ongoing organizational framework for carrying out its objectives.

- 107. As described above, Tapang and each DOES Defendant participated in the operation or management of the Enterprise.
- 108. Because ADF raises hundreds of thousands of dollars to support their terrorist operations in Cameroon, by contacting sympathetic USA based Anglophone Cameroon natives, it affects interstate and foreign commerce.
- 109. Tapang and each DOES Defendant conducted and/or participated in the affairs of the Enterprise through a pattern of racketeering activity, including acts indictable under 18 U.S.C. §2(a) Aiding, abetting, counseling, commanding, inducing or procuring a federal crime; 18 U.S.C. §371 Conspiring to commit a federal crime; 18 U.S.C. §2332b Conspiring to commit an act of terrorism; 18 U.S.C. §2339A Providing material support to terrorists; 18 U.S.C. §2339C Prohibitions against the financing of terrorism; without limitation.

B. Alternatively, and at the Very Least, ADF Was Part of an Association-In-Fact Enterprise

110. Alternatively, and at the very least, ADF was part of an Association-In-Fact Enterprise comprising Tapang and DOES defendants, ADF, and similar organizations. The Association-In-Fact Enterprise was formed by at least January 2017. From that time until present, the members of the Association-In-Fact Enterprise worked together to further their mutual goals of separation from the Republic of Cameroon to form an Ambazonia state, using guerilla tactics, terrorism, providing material support to ADF fighters and related organizations, violence and intimidation of Anglophone Cameroonians who do not support their political aims, kidnappings, and other evil atrocities.

making and communicating group decisions. The Association-In-Fact knows how to reach its ADF fighters, agents, camps to provide instructions on what carnage to execute on designated dates and times, including the May 20th attacks.

112. As described above, each Defendant participated in the operation or management of the Association-In-Fact Enterprise, and benefitted financially from the enterprise.

111. The Association-In-Fact Enterprise has an ongoing organizational

framework for carrying out its objectives. In fact, the Association-In-Fact Enterprise

could not have carried out its intricate task of sharing confidential information at the

moments when it would be most beneficial to ADF unless it had some structure for

113. Because the Association-In-Fact Enterprise's activities including the raising of funds from Cameroon native sympathizers across the 50 states of the USA, using interstate transportation and communications, traveling interstate to give speeches, incite support, obtain goods and services for the ADF based operatives in Cameroon, it affected interstate and foreign commerce.

C. RICO Predicate Acts

- 114. Each Defendant conducted and/or participated in the affairs of ADF and the Association-In-Fact Enterprise through a pattern of racketeering activity, including acts indictable under 18 U.S.C. §2(a) Aiding, abetting, counseling, commanding, inducing or procuring a federal crime; 18 U.S.C. §371 Conspiring to commit a federal crime; 18 U.S.C. §2332b Conspiring to commit an act of terrorism; 18 U.S.C. §2339A Providing material support to terrorists; 18 U.S.C. §2339C Prohibitions against the financing of terrorism; without limitation.
- 115. Additional facts, conduct, actions, of Tapang and DOES defendants, including ADF, acting jointly, and in concert with each other, are as noted in the Exhibit A and Exhibit B documents listed with links to the videos, as well as videos listed, with hyperlinks to the videos.

C. RICO Damages

116. Plaintiff has been injured by Defendants' violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1962(c). Defendants caused enormous harm to Plaintiff, as described above. All of these injuries occurred within the United States.

FIFTH CAUSE OF ACTION

FOR RICO CONSPIRACY (18 U.S.C. § 1962(D))

- 117. Plaintiff re-alleges and incorporates by reference all prior paragraphs of this Complaint and paragraphs in the counts below as though set forth fully herein.
- 118. Defendants conspired with each other to violate 18 U.S.C. § 1962(c). Defendants knowingly agreed, combined, and conspired to conduct the affairs of the Enterprise or the Association-In-Fact Enterprise through ADF operations, Interim Government ("IG") operations, Southern Cameroons Defense Forces (SOCADEF) operations, and the like. Each Defendant agreed that the operation would involve repeated violations of 18 U.S.C. §2(a) Aiding, abetting, counseling, commanding, inducing or procuring a federal crime; 18 U.S.C. §371 Conspiring to commit a federal crime; 18 U.S.C. §2332b Conspiring to commit an act of terrorism; 18 U.S.C. §2339A Providing material support to terrorists; 18 U.S.C. §2339C Prohibitions against the financing of terrorism; without limitation Defendants' conspiracy to violate 18 U.S.C. § 1962(c) violated § 1962(d).
- 119. Plaintiffs have been injured by Defendants' violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1962(d). Plaintiffs have been injured by Defendants' violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1962(c). Defendants caused enormous harm to Plaintiff's. All of these injuries occurred within the United States.

SIXTH CAUSE OF ACTION LIABILITY FOR AIDING AND ABETTING ACTS OF INTERNATIONAL TERRORISM PURSUANT TO 18 U.S.C. § 2333(a)

- 120. Plaintiffs repeat and re-allege each and every allegation of the foregoing paragraphs as if fully set forth herein.
- 121. Tapang and ADF have committed, planned, or authorized activities that involved violence or acts dangerous to human life that are a violation of the criminal laws of the United States, or that would be a criminal violation if committed within the jurisdiction of the United States, including inter alia the prohibition on killing, attempting to kill, causing serious bodily injury, or attempting to cause serious bodily injury, as set forth in 18 U.S.C. § 2332, as well as crimes of assault, battery, criminal conspiracy.
- 122. These activities committed, planned, or authorized by Tapang and his ADF appear to have been, and were intended to: (a) intimidate or coerce the civilian populations of Cameroon; (b) influence the policy of the Government of Cameroon by intimidation or coercion; or (c) affect the conduct of the Governments Cameroon, France, the United States and other countries by violence, destruction of property, killings of government officials, kidnapping, and intimidation.
- 123. These activities committed, planned, or authorized by Tapang and ADF occurred partially outside of the territorial jurisdiction of the United States and constituted acts of international terrorism as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 2331(1).
- 124. Plaintiffs have been injured in their person by reason of the acts of international terrorism committed, planned, or authorized by Tapang and ADF.
- 125. At all times relevant to this action, Defendant Tapang knew that ADF was an Organization, that it had engaged in and continued to engage in illegal acts of terrorism, including international terrorism.
- 126. Defendants knowingly provided substantial assistance and encouragement to ADF and related armed groups and militia in Cameroon, and thus aided and abetted ADF and these armed separatists groups in committing, planning,

or authorizing acts of international terrorism, including the acts of international terrorism that injured Plaintiffs.

127. By aiding and abetting ADF and related armed groups and militia in Cameroon in committing, planning, or authorizing acts of international terrorism, including acts that caused each of the Plaintiffs to be injured in his or her person and property, Defendants are liable pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 2333(a) and (d) for threefold any and all damages that Plaintiffs have sustained as a result of such injuries, and the costs of this suit, including attorney's fees.

SEVENTH CAUSE OF ACTION LIABILITY FOR CONSPIRING IN FURTHERANCE OF ACTS OF INTERNATIONAL TERRORISM PURSUANT TO 18 U.S.C. § 2333(a)

- 128. Plaintiffs repeat and re-allege each and every allegation of the foregoing paragraphs as if fully set forth herein.
- 129. Defendant Tapang knowingly agreed, licensed, and permitted ADF and its affiliates to register and use Defendants' platform, Facebook posts, WhatsApp account, twitter, phone communications, financial support, fundraising, conduct, actions, participations, and other services to promote and carry out ADF's activities, including ADF's illegal acts of international terrorism that injured Plaintiffs.
- 130. Defendant Tapang were aware that U.S. federal law prohibited providing material support and resources to, or engaging in transactions with, terrorist organizations and/or engaging in acts constituting international terrorism.
- 131. Defendant Tapang thus conspired with ADF in its illegal provision of Defendants' platform, Facebook posts, WhatsApp account, twitter, phone communications, and conduct, financial support, fundraising, actions, participations other services to promote and carry out ADF's illegal acts of international terrorism, including the acts that injured Plaintiffs.

- 139. By committing violations of 18 U.S.C. § 2339A that have caused the Plaintiffs to be injured in his or her person, business or property, Defendants are liable pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 2333 for any and all damages that Plaintiffs have sustained as a result of such injuries.

NINTH CAUSE OF ACTION NEGLIGENT INFLICTION OF EMOTIONAL DISTRESS

- 140. Plaintiffs repeat and re-allege each of the foregoing allegations with the same force and effect as if more fully set forth herein.
- 141. Tapang engaged in negligent behavior by providing services, material support, training, expert advice or assistance, personnel, social media platform, other media communications, to ADF and related armed separatist groups.
- 142. Tapang's acts of providing the aforenoted actions to ADF and other armed separatist groups constituted a willful violation of federal statutes, and thus amounted to a willful violation of a statutory standard.
- 143. As a direct, foreseeable and proximate result of the conduct of Tapang as alleged herein above, Plaintiffs has suffered severe emotional distress, and therefore Tapang is liable to the Plaintiffs for Plaintiffs' severe emotional distress and related damages.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

- g) Issuing an Injunction, including a preliminary injunction,: restraining Tapang and his agents, fighters, organization, and those acting in active concert or participation with him from: engaging in conduct as alleged in this Complaint, and principally the material support of terrorism in Cameroon, and including, but not limited to an injunction against engaging in these crimes: 18 U.S.C. §2(a) Aiding, abetting, counseling, commanding, inducing or procuring a federal crime; 18 U.S.C. §371 Conspiring to commit a federal crime; 18 U.S.C. §2332b Conspiring to commit an act of terrorism; 18 U.S.C. §2339A Providing material support to terrorists; 18 U.S.C. §2339C Prohibitions against the financing of terrorism; kidnapping, assault, battery, murder, destruction of property, civilian intimidation and threats, without limitation.

- h) Awarding Plaintiff all costs and attorneys' fees to the full extent permitted under the applicable law;
- i) Awarding Plaintiff pre- and post-judgment interest as permitted by law;
- j) Awarding any other relief as the Court may deem just and proper.
- k) That the Court, *sua sponte*, with its inherent Constitutional and Statutory powers to ensure justice, and to help save lives and pain and sufferings of similar plaintiffs within its jurisdiction:
 - a. Refer this matter to the terrorism units of the FBI with jurisdiction over this defendant Tapang who lives and works within the San Jose community, with most persons oblivious to his true person, as his conduct and actions present a clear and present danger of imminent terrorism that harms US citizens, for investigations and assessment consistent with the allegations herein;
 - b. Refer this matter to the terrorism units of the California State and local police with jurisdiction over the defendant Tapang, as his conduct and actions present a clear and present danger of terrorism imminent that harms US citizens, for investigations and assessment consistent with the allegations herein;
 - c. Refer this defendant Tapang, an immigrant, to the United States Department of Homeland Security ("DHS"), Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and other related DHS agencies, for immediate investigation and assessment to determine whether his conduct and actions present a clear and present danger of imminent terrorism that harms US citizens, for investigations consistent with the allegations herein;
 - d. All other actions which this Court deems appropriate to prevent terrorist acts emanating from Tapang harming US citizens and residents.

II. Abuses by Armed Separatist Groups

Groups of armed separatists emerged following the government's suppression of the 2016 demonstrations, and gained further support from the diaspora and local communities after the government's heavy-handed response to the September and October 2017 demonstrations.

Many of these groups have a robust following online and appear to be supported by strong diaspora networks in the US, United Kingdom, Nigeria, and South Africa. Some of these foreign-based online activists have since proclaimed themselves to be "commanders" of armed groups and many have used inflammatory and hateful rhetoric against Francophones and government security forces, calling them "dogs," "animals," or "terrorists," accusing them of "genocide," and urging fighters to send them "home to meet their father Lucifer."³⁷

According to the Armed Conflict Location and Event Database (ACLED), an independent media monitor, the pace and scale of attacks by armed separatists against security forces, government workers, and state institutions more than doubled in late 2017 and continued to increase following the January 2018 arrest and deportation of the 47 secessionist activists from Nigeria.³⁸

How many groups are there?

An independent Cameroonian journalist who has investigated the groups and spoke to Human Rights Watch estimates that between 5 and 20 groups operate in the two regions.³⁹ In a December 2017 statement, the International Crisis Group (ICG) estimated the various groups comprise about 500 fighters in total.⁴⁰ The most militant and well-known groups include:

- The Ambazonia Defense Forces (ADF), which emerged in late 2017 under the
 reported command of Ayaba Cho Lucas, a former Southern Cameroons Youth
 League activist, now self-styled leader-in-exile and commander-in-chief of the
 Ambazonia Governing Council, operating mostly in the South-West's Mamfe
 area;
- The Southern Cameroons Defense Forces (SOCADEF), reportedly with a
 presence in the South-West region's administrative division of Meme and
 under the control of Ebenezer Akwanga, a former political prisoner now living
 in the US, and an individual known as "General Molua C";
- The Lebialem Red Dragons, with a reported presence in the South-West's Lebialem division and;
- The Ambazonia Self-Defence Council, created by the putative "Interim Government" in March 2018 and encompassing:
 - The Ambazonia Restoration Army, a militia reportedly under control of General Paxson Agbor, a former police officer;
 - The Tigers of Ambazonia, a militia with a presence in the South-West region's Meme and Manyu divisions;
 - The Southern Cameroons Defense Forces (SCDF), led by Nso Foncha Nkem, an Anglophone Cameroonian who is rumored to have served in the US army, and;

 The Manyu Ghost Warriors, with a presence in the South-West region's Manyu division.⁴¹

It is unclear how these groups are structured and to what degree they coordinate with one another. An independent journalist, a local civil society activist, and three villagers from two different localities told researchers that some groups have a structure at the local level, with village level commanders appearing to report to regional commanders.⁴²

"It is structured as such that they have a general or a leader for each village," a civil society activist who traveled to areas controlled by armed separatists in March 2018 told Human Rights Watch. "We were stopped at a checkpoint by Ambazonian boys. When I said that I am with an NGO, they pulled me aside. I was questioned and eventually the leader let me go after getting instructions on the phone from someone else," she said.⁴³

The government said that armed separatists have killed over 100 civilians and 84 security forces personnel since the conflict erupted. 44 While Human Rights Watch has not been able to ascertain the total number of civilian fatalities by armed separatists, witness accounts and credible media reports present strong evidence that civilians

perceived to collaborate with the government have also been targeted by these groups for extortion, torture, and murder.45

In the South-West region's Meme division for instance, armed separatists have targeted at least two civilians who hail from the mostly francophone Bamileke ethnic group for kidnapping and extortion. Two Bamileke traders told Human Rights Watch that in February 2018 a group of armed separatists came to one's home and the other's shop and accused them of supporting the government, badly beating one of them. One of the traders recalled:

These youths took me to their chief and he asked if I was Bamileke. I said yes and then he said that they would kill us all. They beat me with their guns and the flat side of a machete. I was on the ground and bleeding. They wanted me to confess that I was a traitor. I refused so they let me go after I gave them money.46

In another case, a local civil society activist recounted how she heard from villagers that the armed separatists located in Foe Bakundu executed a man they accused of being an informant in March 2018. "They tortured him and he died," she said.47

Attacks on Students, Teachers, and Schools

In November 2016, Anglophone teachers went on strike to protest perceived discrimination against English-speaking teachers and students in the country's education system.

A private school principal told Human Rights Watch he thought the November 2016 strike would only last a few days. "We had a class with [the students] and told them on Monday the 21st, 'Don't come to school because teachers trade union is calling a strike.' We

thought that the strike would last one to two days as normal," he said. "Little did we know that it would last until the situation we have today." 48

The majority of teacher unions called off their strike in February 2017.49 "We had made our point and we wanted to go back to school," one union leader involved in the deliberations told Human Rights Watch.50 But separatist activists continued to push the local population to refrain from returning their children to school as a tactic to pressure the government.

A teacher told Human Rights Watch: "The general information was that everyone should boycott [schools]. So there were those who were respecting it out of convictions and others respecting it out of fear that something would happen to their children."51

Kidnapping of Principals

In 2018, armed separatists abducted at least three principals whose schools had opened.

On the morning of April 30, principal Father William Neba of St. Bede's College, in Ashing near Belo, North-West region, was reported to have been abducted while celebrating mass with students. He was released two days later. The school suspended classes on the day of the abduction.⁵²

On May 25, 2018, in two separate incidents just days before the start of the national exams, the principal of Government High School Bolifamba Mile 16, Georgiana Enanga

Sanga, and the principal of Cameroon Baptist Academy Muyuka, Eric Ngomba, were kidnapped.

In a video circulated online, Ngomba is seen sitting on the ground outdoors and surrounded by three armed men pointing weapons at his head as he is questioned. A voice off camera says that Ngomba was detained because he is the principal of a functioning school. The men prompt Ngomba to call on his fellow teachers and principals to close all schools "in this Amba region" and advise his colleagues not to administer the national exams. Both principals were released, Enanga unharmed, Ngomba with machete wounds.⁵³

Attacks on Student and Teacher

Human Rights Watch documented one case in which a teacher was shot in the face in early 2018 in the North-West. A relative said she was found "in a pool of blood" shortly after the attack, adding that "now, she can only communicate by writing. She cannot chew, she can only eat soft food. The wound has not healed." Her attackers were not identified or apprehended, but the relative explained that "she had received threats before because people were throwing tracts [written threats] at the school and even up to her house." 54

In another case documented by Human Rights Watch, Emmanuel Galega, a student, was shot and killed by people believed to be armed separatists who conducted an attack on a high school dormitory in Widikum on March 26, 2018. A man who lived in Widikum at the time of the attack told researchers the armed separatists had conducted two attacks against security forces in the weeks that led to the attack on the school. "People saw [the Ambazonian guys] come to the village that night. They went to the school because they had given information [to close the school] by dropping a note two months earlier. They came and went there and started shooting their guns. One child was shot," he said.55

Arson Attacks on Schools

Ahead of the resumption of the school year in September 2017, media reported that unknown attackers partially burned over half a dozen schools at night. 56 The burning of schools, irrespective of their language of instruction, continued in a number of localities throughout late 2017 and early 2018. In June 2018, UNICEF reported that 58 schools had been damaged since the beginning of the crisis in the North-West and South-West regions. 57

In general, these arson attacks occurred late at night or in the early morning. Claims of responsibility do not appear to have been left at the scene of attacks. However, a media report states that following an arson attack on the Government High School Bafut on May 8, 2018, a note was left calling for no schools to operate. Government schools, non-denominational private schools, and Catholic, Presbyterian, and Baptist schools have all been targeted for attack.

For example, in one arson attack against the Presbyterian Secondary School Bafut in the early morning of November 1, 2017, three female dormitories for girls were set on fire, and many students lost their belongings in the blaze. A teacher from the school described the scene after the flames were put out, as parents rushed to the school to collect their children: "I could see the roofs of these dormitories were ravaged by fire and had burned down. And the walls of the dormitories were covered in smoke."59

In another case, a father dropping his two children off at their kindergarten in Mezam division, North-West region, in February 2018, discovered that the school's administrative block had been burned down over the night. The school closed for two weeks after the incident. "The teachers and the pupils are under great fear and panic," said the father. 60

The administrator of one partially burned school in August 2017 estimated the damage at 5.5 million CFA (US\$9,800), including to school infrastructures, benches, books, and teaching materials.⁶¹ He noted that enrollment dropped from around 325 students to just 77 following the arson attack. "We've never closed," he said, adding, "No matter the crisis, children have a right to education."⁶²

Threats to Students, Parents, and Teachers

To enforce the boycott, separatist activists began to threaten the lives of teachers and children, and the burning of schools via social media, text messages, and printed notices (referred to locally as "tracts"). The aim was to ensure schools would not reopen or that children would not attend during the 2016-2017 school year, and the first half of the 2017-2018 school year.

Sometimes the threats have been general, and at other times directed at individual schools, or at named individual educators. In at least one case documented by Human Rights Watch, one principal told researchers that one evening in December 2017 around 11 p.m., rocks covered in petrol were placed under his car and set alight. "The whole house could have burned," said the principal, as his car was parked in a basement below his house. He had previously received a letter noting that he was a school principal with a demand of 500,000 CFA (\$900) to support the separatist cause.⁶⁴

As an example of the violent online threats, on September 5, 2017, a group that calls themselves "Ambazonia freedom fighters" posted on Facebook a photo of five identifiable children sitting at school desks, calling them examples of "betrayals," and urging followers to "stone them." See figure 1 for another example of online threats.

Education officials told Human
Rights Watch that printed notices
were particularly common in late
2017 as some schools prepared to
open, or opened, for the 2017-2018
academic year.⁶⁶ The same teachers
reported finding such "tracts" left

around towns, near schools, near teacher's houses, and posted on electricity poles.

Although the tracts are generally not signed by any individual or group, teachers we spoke with all attributed them to separatist activists. One example obtained by Human Rights Watch was written by individuals referring to themselves as "We Southern Cameroonians."

Such threats were often effective. One school administrator of a combined nursery and primary school in Kumbo told Human Rights Watch how one day in the first week of November 2017 there were printed fliers outside the school gate and slipped under the school door reading "Fire! Fire! Fire!" and warning that the school would be burned if it

continued operating. "So we closed the gate, and did not open again until January [2018]. Some students still haven't come back."68

Negative Consequences for Children's Education

Either because of these threats, or as a show of solidarity by parents and teachers with the separatist cause, or both, school enrollment levels have dropped precipitously during the crisis.⁶⁹ The majority of the schools across the North-West and South-West regions were closed for most of the academic year of 2016-2017. In May 2018, an estimated 42,500 children were still out of school according to OCHA.⁷⁰

A father told researchers that he was keeping his secondary-school-aged daughter at home. "You hear of a child killed somewhere, of a teacher killed somewhere, of a school burned somewhere. You are not sure of the house you are living," he said. "I don't feel safe sending her.... She has been out of school for almost two years."

Some students have diverted to vocational trainings, such as in computers, information technology, sewing, and hairdressing.⁷² But, as multiple educators told Human Rights Watch, many have stopped studying all together and stay at home or work.⁷³ Several interviewees expressed concerns about increasing pregnancy of teenage girls who are out

of school.74 "I saw six of my students are pregnant, they're aged between 13 and 16," one teacher from a rural government school told Human Rights Watch.75

Some worried that the longer students are out of school, the less likely it is they will return. "Children have tasted small money in jobs…so getting them back to school is going to be so difficult," said one woman who worked for an NGO concerned with children's education.⁷⁶

"They don't want to come to school again," said the principal of a school that once had an enrollment of 485 students before the crisis, but only 45 when Human Rights Watch visited." Other educators reported enrollment rates at their schools from 30 to 66 percent of pre-crises levels. As of April 2018, some schools were still empty. For example, a school administrator for a number of schools in Bui division told us in April that at two of his schools "not a child has gone to school," even though they had enrollments of 130 and 75 students prior to the crisis. A teacher from a rural government school told us her school had enrollment of around 1,000 prior to the crisis, but as of April had only two students in attendance, because they were determined to take the national exams. So

An administrator from a primary school in Kumbo said that in early 2018 enrollment had climbed to around 200 students, but before the crisis enrollment had been between 600 to 700 students. Another administrator of an urban school that had 1,210 students before the crisis reported 570 students in early April 2018. She said the school reopened in August 2017, and, "We started with five, ten, fifteen students, they were trickling, trickling in." An administrator of a combined nursery and primary school said his school had just returned to half the enrollment they had before the crisis. A teacher who works at one government school and one Presbyterian school noted that the government school had returned to 180 students, down from 600, meanwhile the other school had more than 800 students, down from pre-crises enrollment of 1,200 students. The education secretary overseeing Presbyterian schools in the North-West reported that their primary schools had 15,079 students before the crises, and 4,912 by mid-April. The education secretary overseeing Catholic schools in the North-West said that in November 2016 they had 19,599 students registered, but as of April only 6,250. The quality of teaching is also affected. One teacher at a government secondary school told us how she felt returning to a school, where the principal had received a visit from "some boys" who threatened him and told him to close the schools. "Going to teach [the following day] was like a nightmare for me," she told Human Rights Watch. "I was looking more outside the window and door and not concentrating on teaching because anything could happen."81

Safe Schools Declaration

Cameroon has not yet endorsed the Safe Schools Declaration, an inter-governmental commitment by countries to better protect students, teachers, schools and universities during times of conflict. Many of its commitments could be relevant to ensure protection of education in the country. In particular, the Declaration encourages:

- The collection of relevant data on attacks on education facilities, on the victims of attacks, and on the military use of schools and universities;
- Investigations of allegations of violations of applicable national and international law and, where appropriate, the prosecution of the responsible perpetrators;
- The development of conflict-sensitive approaches to education;
- Ensuring the continuation of education even during conflict situations;
- The re-establishment of educational facilities; and
- International cooperation and assistance to respond to attacks on education.

In addition, countries that endorse the Safe Schools Declaration commit to use *Guidelines on Protecting Schools and Universities from Military Use during Armed Conflict*, which contain suggestions on how to minimize the potential negative consequences when security forces are deployed to protect schools that have been threatened with attack.

The Peace and Security Council of the African Union (AU) has called upon all AU members states to endorse the Declaration. In November 2017, Cameroon's minister of basic education wrote to the Governor of the Far North calling for respect for the Declaration.
